The **Department of Surgery** at **Rush University Medical Center** is seeking a non-clinical investigator, at the Assistant Professor or above, focused on **Surgical Outcomes and Health Services** to join its team. The selected candidate will partner with clinical faculty in Colon & Rectal Surgery, General Surgery, Surgical Oncology, Urology, Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery, Transplant Surgery, and Minimally-Invasive & Bariatric Surgery to develop, design, implement and publish high quality research in the areas of surgical outcomes, health services, access to care & health disparities, quality & efficacy and cost effectiveness. The investigator will mentor 1-2 residents per year, which shall include training in developing hypotheses and specific aims, designing retrospective and prospective research plans, identifying resources, carrying out the research plan, and publishing/presenting. The selected candidate is expected to compete for external funding, both independently and in collaboration with other faculty.

Eligible candidates must hold a **PhD** in a relevant field, ideally from an integrated health program. Candidates must demonstrate experience in the field through successful grant applications and/or peer-reviewed publications in surgical outcomes, health services or related fields. Candidates must have formal training in biostatistics and research design & methodology. Candidates must also show potential for establishing an externally funded research program and, preferably, demonstrate a history of successful grant proposals. Ideal candidates will be familiar with national databases (ex. NIS).
